To top it off, we had two new members join: Julie Griffith and Sheryl Fox. Be sure to introduce yourself to them at the next meeting.


Our next General Meeting will be the last meeting for this term, and we will be dark




#### ADVOCATES FOR CHILDREN: Chairman Sue Herrera


