At the Police Department's K9 and Family Festival, we volunteered and got to meet numerous other community/philanthropic organizations. (Networking is a good thing.)


National Night Out was productive, we donated school supplies to the P.D. there, sold blankets for fundraising, and met several prospective members who visited our booth.
